In his critically acclaimed debut novel, **GARY SHTEYNGART** recounts the adventures of Vladimir Girshkin – a Russian Jewish immigrant, part P.T. Barnum and part V.I. Lenin, the man who would conquer half of Europe (albeit the wrong half). Shteyngart's antic narrative reflects on what it means to be both an outsider and an insider in America as it moves from the pierced, polyglot hipsters of Manhattan to "the SoHo of Eastern Europe" in the satiric *The Russian Debutante's Handbook* (Riverhead, \$14.00).



**DAN GLICK**

In the wake of divorce and his brother's death, Colorado author **DAN GLICK** embarked on single fatherhood in an unusual way: he took his kids on a journey around the world, to see some of the world's rare life forms before they disappeared. *Monkey Dancing* (PublicAffairs, \$26.00) weaves accounts of their encounters with the natural world – and each other – with intimate reflections on his own reckoning with loss, change, and fatherhood, and illuminates the parallels between our relationships with each other, and those with the earth we inhabit.



**RICK REILLY**

Over the course of two years, award-winning writer **RICK REILLY** asked, begged, cajoled, and finally convinced twelve pro and amateur golfers to let him loop for them. *Who's Your Caddy?* (Doubleday, \$24.95) finds the *Sports Illustrated* columnist inadvertently kicking perfect lies into the rough, spectacularly misreading greens, and jinxing players with ill-timed commentaries. Written with Reilly's characteristic intelligence and wit, this is an eye-opening and entertaining look at the game of golf, in all its quirky glory.

Thursday, June 5, 7:30 p.m.

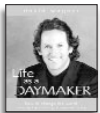
